

OAKLAND CITY COUNCIL  
JUNE 29, 2009  
SPECIAL SESSION

The Special Session of the Oakland City Council met at Oakland City Hall and was called to order by Mayor Tim White at 5:00 P.M. Council Members present were Wede, Rollins, Moniz and Gleaves. Absent was Newberg. Also present were Public Works Director Mike Baragary, City Clerk Marissa Lockwood and Fire Chief Lonnie Smith. Motion by Rollins, second by Moniz to approve the agenda with the addition of discussing the State I-JOBS money and the Fourth of July event. 4 Ayes, motion carried.

Discussion was held on the extra rescue truck payment. Motion by Gleaves, second by Moniz to pay the \$22,636.84 that was budgeted in debt service for FY09. 4 Ayes, motion carried. Further discussion on the Fire Departments income will be held at the July regular meeting.

The HMGP Grant Agreement was discussed. Motion by Wede, second by Rollins to approve the HMGP Grant Agreement with Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management. Wede, Rollins, Gleaves - Ayes, Moniz - No. Motion carried.

Motion by Gleaves, second by Wede to approve the Estoppel Certificate and Consent to Assignment for Tower Site Lease from Teleservices, Ltd. to Our Cable, LLC. with Mayor White not signing the agreement until after Lockwood verifies the lease payment amount with Teleservices, Ltd. Rollins, Wede, Gleaves – Ayes, Moniz – No. Motion carried.

Property at 316-320 Oakland Avenue was discussed. The property owners are working on fixing up the building and are planning to apply for the City's TIF grant; they will have a project list with costs as soon as possible.

Snyder and Associates is looking into money from the State's I-JOBS program for tearing down old buildings. Dave Sturm is meeting with Baragary and White tomorrow about possible funding.

Discussion was held on the Fourth of July events. Gene and Loree Hamilton received the most votes for Grand Marshall of the parade. Moniz will contact Mr. and Mrs. Hamilton. The Council members are going to serve the dinner. Gleaves updated the Council on how the Pig Bingo will work. The City Council decided that half of the money for the pig bingo will go to the winner and the other half will go towards the pool.

Motion by Rollins, second by Gleaves to adjourn. 4 Ayes, motion carried
