OAKLAND CITY COUNCIL APRIL 8, 2024 REGULAR SESSION

The Regular Session of the Oakland City Council met in the Oakland City Services Building and was called to order by Mayor Brant Miller at 7:04p.m. Pledge of Allegiance was said. Council Members present were Applegate, Bernard, Moniz, Perkins, and Reed. City staff present were City Administrator/Clerk Marissa Lockwood and Public Works Director Kris Bramman. Public present were Joan Shanno, J.R. Becker, Kevin and Niki Ford. Motion by Bernard, second by Moniz to approve the agenda. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Open forum was held. Joan Shanno asked about upcoming street projects and street signs needing straightened. Kevin and Niki Ford discussed their concerns with Cyclone Street and inquired about future plans for Hurricane Lane and Idlewood Road once annexed.

Motion by Perkins to approve the consent agenda including March Clerk Report, April Claims, March Library Report, Golf Course Report, Sheriff's Report, minutes from March 11th regular session and March 25th special session, fire department minutes and liquor license for Taylor Quik Pik. Second by Applegate. Roll call. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Public hearing regarding Water System Improvements – Wells SRF Environmental Review was opened at 7:17p.m. No written or oral comments were received. Public hearing was closed at 7:18p.m.

Discussion was held concerning baseball and softball field lighting replacement. Motion by Reed to table until next meeting to receive additional bids. Second by Bernard. 5 ayes, motion carried.

North water tower riser pipe issues were discussed. Motion by Perkins, second by Moniz to approve bid from Viking to replace the north water tower riser pipe in the amount of \$107,873 at the same time that the tower is down for painting and maintenance. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Reed, second by Bernard to approve J & M Displays Fireworks Agreement in the amount of \$5,690 for the July 4, 2024, fireworks show. 5 ayes, motion carried.

The upcoming pool season was discussed. Reminder that the community meeting to discuss future pool improvements is Sunday, April 14th at 6:00p.m. at the community building. Motion by Reed, second by Perkins to approve Resolution 2024-04-01 Hiring Jamie J and Jamie E Meek as pool co-managers for 2024 at \$19.00 per hour. Roll call. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Reed to approve Resolution 2024-04-04 "Approving Construction Contract and Bonds" for Wastewater Improvements Project – Lift Station Generators. Second by Applegate. Roll call. 5 ayes, motion carried. Wastewater Improvements Project – Lagoons was discussed. Motion by Bernard to approve change order #2 extending the contract by 83 days to allow for fall biosolid land application, second by Moniz. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Personnel committee discussion was held. Motion by Bernard to approve Resolution 2024-04-02 "Setting Employee Wages" giving Josh Billings a 5% increase to \$62,373.79 per year. Second by Moniz. Roll call. 5 ayes, motion carried. Motion by Perkins to approve Resolution 2024-04-03 "Setting Employee Wages" giving Kris Bramman an increase of 5% to \$92,399.75 per year. Second by Reed. 5 ayes, motion carried. Motion by Perkins to approve Resolution 2024-04-05 "Setting Employee Wages" giving Dylan Bees an increase of \$1.00 per hour to \$67,743.62 per year for receiving Wastewater Lagoon certification. Second by Bernard. 5 ayes, motion carried. Motion by Reed, second by Bernard to advertise to fill the open public works labor position. 5 ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Moniz, second by Applegate to set the fiscal year 2025 budget adoption hearing as April 24, 2024, at 4:30p.m.

Bramman gave the Crew Report. Concession stand and restrooms are ready for the season, seasonal mowers have started, will be getting ballfield infield mix delivered.

Lockwood gave the Clerk's Report. City hall will be closed April 17-19, 2024, for clerks to attend the spring IMFOA Conference. Miller gave the Mayor's Report. Amphitheater project is coming along, update on the golf course irrigation project. Motion by Moniz, second by Applegate to adjourn. 5 ayes, motion carried. Adjournment 8:00p.m.
